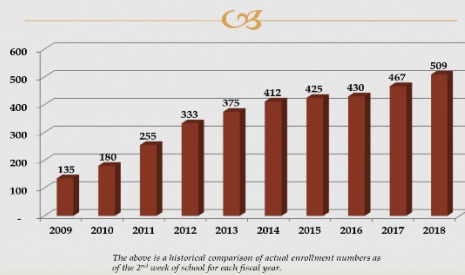

## TALLULAH FALLS SCHOOL

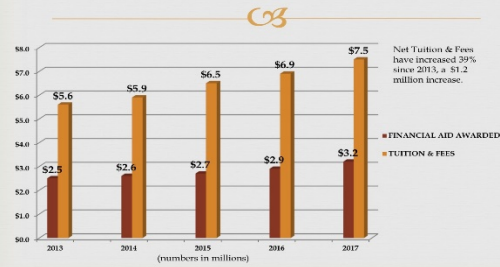

## PUBLIC ISSUES

With all the recent controversy around proper etiquette for the national anthem, perhaps a little history would be of interest:

The National Anthem Committee (NAC) adopted *The Code for the National Anthem of the United States of America* in April 1942. The Code included such details as:

- the proper key for performances (A-flat)
- requiring no liberty be taken in either style or substance with the approved version of the National Anthem
- the requirement of an announcement before the anthem for the assembled to join in singing
- mandating the tempo of the anthem, and specified that on the metronome—settings 104bpm for the verses and 96bpm for the chorus.

Congress approved the following text in June 1942. The Congressional version left out many of the details recommended by the committee but added the phrase—*with the right hand over the heart*—which was not contained in the NAC document.

*U.S. Code, Title 36, Subtitle 1, Part A, Chapter 3, Section 301-National Anthem. Here it is.*

### *Sec. 301. National anthem*

*(a) Designation.—The composition consisting of the words and music known as the Star-Spangled Banner is the national anthem.*

*(b) Conduct During Playing.—During a rendition of the national anthem—*

*(1) when the flag is displayed—*

*(A) all present except those in uniform should stand at attention facing the flag with the right hand over the heart;*

*(B) men not in uniform should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold the headdress at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart; and*

*(C) individuals in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note; and*

*(2) When the flag is not displayed, all present should face toward the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed.*
