## **GA FESTIVAL OF TREES**

Instructions on signing up to volunteer at the GA Festival of Trees:

Log into [www.gafestivaloftrees.org](http://www.gafestivaloftrees.org). Click on the Volunteer Button located top right of page.

Complete a brief sign-up form, and then you will be directed to the Georgia Festival of Trees Volunteer Portal.

You should see this message in the volunteer portal:

*Welcome to the Georgia Festival of Trees Volunteer Portal! We are so glad you are here! There are two steps to become a festival volunteer.*

1. ***Complete the volunteer registration by clicking the "Sign-Up For This Organization" button.***  
*Be sure to answer all the questions thoroughly. These questions help us match you to volunteer opportunities that suit you best.*
2. ***Complete a background check.*** *Because our volunteers engage with the general public (including children), we require a criminal and sex offender background screening. This must be completed within two weeks of registration. The process is simple, easy, and only \$15.00. Just click the button below to be redirected to our secure background check provider.*

Notes:

- Don't forget to write down your volunteer portal ID and password.
- Under "Group" on the volunteer registration form, please select GFWC.
- Our GFWC day is **Friday**, December 3 from 9 am – 2 pm. \*\*Choose this day and time(s).
- Every volunteer must complete the background check and pay the \$15 fee.
- **IMPORTANT:** Please tell Pam Ashman if you have signed up and completed the BG Check by **October 22**. GFWC members will be working either in the Elf Emporium or Mistletoe Mall. There are various roles in both gift shops such as cashier, stocker, personal helper, etc.

## **ARTS COMPETITION:**

Under Arts and Culture, we are beginning to think about arts submissions for GFWC competition at the Spring convention. In this month's newsletter, writing is the focus. Members and students are eligible to enter. Please start looking for artistic high school seniors and talented multi-grade authors from our school systems. The rules for writing are as follows:

### **GFWC MEMBER WRITING CONTESTS**

Authors must be current members of an active GFWC club to enter one of these two categories:

- Short Story—Entries are limited to 2,000 words and can be any genre.
- Poetry—Entries can be any style and on any topic with a minimum length of eight lines and a maximum of 50 lines.

### **YOUTH WRITING CONTESTS**

Short Story—Entries are limited to 2,000 words and can be any genre.

- Category 1: Grades K, 1, and 2

- Category 2: Grades 3, 4, and 5
- Category 3: Grades 6, 7, and 8
- Category 4: Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

Poetry—Entries can be any style and on any topic with a minimum length of eight lines and a maximum of 50 lines.

- Category 1: Grades K, 1, and 2
- Category 2: Grades 3, 4, and 5
- Category 3: Grades 6, 7, and 8
- Category 4: Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

#### RULES FOR WRITING CONTESTS

- Entries must be typed, double-spaced, printed on one side only, with minimum margins of one-inch on all four sides, on 8.5 x 11-inch paper.
- Entries must be written between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2020, providing a special allowance for two years of writing for the 2021 contests, since the 2020 Writing Contests were not held. Entries must be written between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021, for the 2022 Writing Contests.
- Entries must have the following on the top right-hand corner of each page:
  - Author's name
  - Email address
  - Mailing address
  - Phone number
  - Name of GFWC Club and State Federation submitting author's work
  - Category
  - Title of work

Authors must be amateurs; earnings from writing may not exceed \$500 annually.

Entries may not have been published prior to the competition and must be original works by the author.

**A signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver must be included with each submission.**

One entry per member per category is allowed.

Manuscripts will not be returned. Authors should retain a copy.

Wells for Hope for South Sudan has an annual walk to raise awareness and money. Thousands of people in South Sudan lack access to safe, clean water. Wells for Hope for South Sudan is designed in part to drill wells in villages where women and girls walk four to six miles each way for water daily. Below is a delicious recipe from Peggy Wilson (given to her from Becky Sanders) that makes healthy eating FUN! This recipe was taken from the GFWC Georgia 125th Anniversary Celebration, A Collection of Recipes.



## HAWAIIAN BANANA NUT BREAD

*Peggy Wilson  
GFWC Morrow Civic Woman's Club  
Central West District*

3 c. all purpose flour	3 eggs, beaten
2 c. sugar	1 ½ c. vegetable oil
1 tsp. baking soda	2 c. mashed ripe bananas
1 tsp. salt	1 (8 ounce) can crushed pineapple, drained
1 tsp. ground cinnamon	2 tsp. vanilla extract
1 c. chopped nuts	

Combine flour, sugar, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon; stir in nuts and set aside. Combine eggs, vegetable oil, bananas, crushed pineapple, and vanilla; add to dry ingredients, stirring just until moistened. Spoon batter into 2 greased and floured 9x5x3 - inch loaf pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour and 5 minutes or until done. (I insert a toothpick to make sure they are done.) Cool 10 minutes before removing from pans. When completely cooled, wrap in plastic wrap. They can be frozen for future use.

**Note:** This recipe was given to me by a very dear friend, Becky Sanders. She was a Georgia Club Woman for many years before she passed away. She made it for many occasions over the years as we worked together in the Morrow Civic Woman's Club. Serving GFWC Georgia for the 2020-2022 administration as Third Vice President.

Clayton County womens' clubs in Morrow Forest Park and Jonesboro enthusiastically combine their gentle beginnings with a growing commitment to active involvement in the community.

Membership in the three clubs continues to grow and now includes professional women as well as full-time homemakers.

The Georgia Federation of Womens' Clubs 6th District Spring Meeting held earlier this month brought Clayton clubwomen out in full force to celebrate the happy blending of tradition and involvement.

The event hosted by the Morrow Junior Woman's Club at Clayton Junior College this year was an impressive success with clubwomen from throughout Georgia attending.

The program—which included entertainment, an awards ceremony and ample opportunities for socializing—marked the end of the Womens' Clubs' 1982-83 year and the beginning of a new year of community involvement.

In Clayton membership in the clubs is growing. The Morrow Junior Woman's club was cited for a dynamic increase in membership at the meeting, winning the silver award in

membership for a growth of 32 members this year.

Membership in the three clubs totals nearly 100 including carter members who have been active in the various clubs for more than 25 years.

An interest in traditional home-making arts such as quilting and crochet is still fostered in the clubs which offer wide-ranging community oriented programs.

Clayton Clubwomen can be found visiting the elderly and aiding in such programs as Meal on Wheels.

The Morrow Junior Woman's Club also promotes political awareness sponsoring a rally every year for public officials who are up for election.

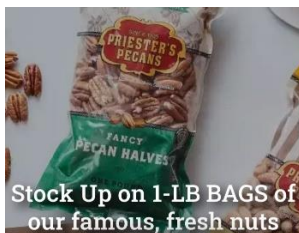
## DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

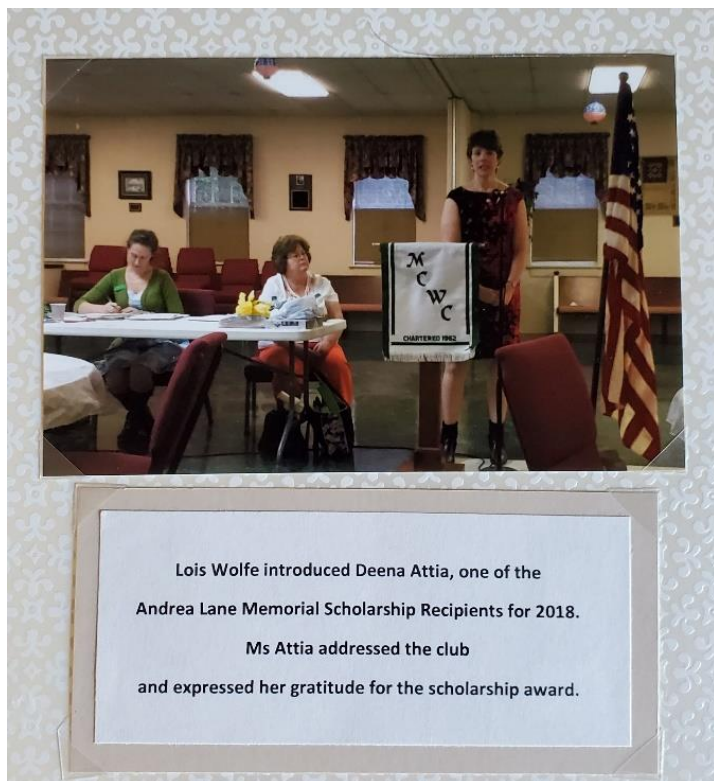
